Sermon by Pastor Rob Dalton, CRE: Advent In Narnia: Part 1

Too often, Christianity may seem to be a known quantity. We can

take its radical values for granted and see Jesus as a cliché instead

of our Savior. Lewis, by placing Christianity into another world, makes it unfamiliar again. He gives us the chance to feel a newfound wonder at the depth of God's love, the power of Christ's grace and the totality of his sacrifice, and the wonder of a world infused with the Holy Spirit. We all can use a spiritual wake-up call like this, whether we aren't sure Christianity can mean anything to us or whether it means everything.





It's Time to Adopt-A-Family! Bring Your Gifts to Church THIS SUNDAY!

This year, our church will adopt children through the annual SERVE Adopt-A-Family program. Each family that applies for assistance is pre-screened, and determined to have I limited income and resources to provide food for their family or gifts for their children. This program provides gifts for the children in the family, groceries for a full holiday meal, and hygiene products for the family. SERVE is asking us to purchase 4 items for each child - Something they want, something they need, something to wear, and something to read. The suggested dollar amount is \$100-\$125 per child, but it is up to the adopter on how much they spend. Please give based on what you can afford.

Here's how you can participate!

- Select a gift tag from the Adopt-A-Family tree. This tag will provide you details about the child such as sizes, needs, and desires, etc. You can use this information as you shop. Don't lose the tag. It will be needed in the next step!
- Please do NOT wrap your Christmas gifts. Instead, keep each child's gifts separate by simply placing them in a black trash bag with the gift tag securely attached to the bag. If you wish to contribute wrapping paper or gift tags to be used by the family, you may place these items in

the back with the gifts. Please also write the ID number on duct tape and place on the bag in case the gift tag comes loose.

 Bring your gifts to the <u>Fellowship Hall by Sunday, December 1st</u> and the Mission Committee will see that they get delivered to the Mueller Center on time.

For those who would like to participate, but are no longer physically able to shop, Elder Shirley

Dixon has volunteered to be your personal shopper for this project.

All young families in our community are invited to browse our collection and take what is needed. There are some guidelines and rules we ask that you follow so that we may help as many families as possible.

- You will be asked to register when you attend the open house then you may look for clothing and pick up diapers.
- You will be given a package of diapers per child (40 diapers in each package) with a package of baby wipes.
- 3 complete outfits per child (includes a pair of shoes, socks, pants or slacks and shirt or dress, jacket, underwear)

Take an ornament and card that explains the project.

This year's ornament represents a moringa seed bag. Moringa trees are often called "the miracle tree." Moringa leaves can be an important source of nutrition since they can be ground and added to food to provide protein, amino acids, vitamins, and minerals in

communities that struggle with malnourishment. Moringa oil is used for cooking oil, in soaps, lamps and lubrication for farm and food production equipment. A gift of a sack of Moringa seeds is enough to start a small nursery of these quickly growing, drought-tolerant trees.


Can You Help Ring a Bell During the Callaway County Red Kettle Campaign This Season?



Top Ten Reasons to Wear Your Nametag in Church....

- 1. **Helps people remember names**: It can be difficult to remember everyone's name, even in small congregations.
- 2. **Saves embarrassment**: It's embarrassing to call someone by the wrong name, and name tags can help avoid this.
- 3. **Invites conversation**: Knowing someone's name breaks down barriers to conversation.
- 4. **Makes fellowship more personal**: Knowing someone's name can make fellowship feel more personal.
- 5. **Guests feel less conspicuous**: Name tags can make guests feel more welcome and part of the group.
- 6. Says "We want to know you": Asking someone for their name says "We want to know you".
- 7. **Provides opportunities for service**: A "nametag" ministry can provide opportunities for service.
- 8. Creates a warm atmosphere: Name tags can help create a warm atmosphere.
- 9. Lowers anxiety: Name tags can help lower anxiety.
- 10. Enhances discussion and prayer: Name tags can help enhance discussion and prayer.
